GUIDELINES FOR PROPER PREPARATION OF FILES


AREA OF THE PRINTOUT

Please mark the **cut lines** and the **inner margin** with a distinct frame and place them on a separate layer.

The **cut line** shows the measurements of a "ready" label (30x60 in this case).

The **art board** should have the same measurements as the **ready file**, alongside with a 1,5mm slope on each side.

The area of the **inner margin** should include elements which cannot be cut off. It might be the edge of a text box or other graphical elements that do not osculate the **edge of the label**.



COLOUR SETTINGS

Please change all the Panton colours to CMYK (file colour mode: CMYK). Moreover, change all additional (spot) colours to primary (process) colours. The exception is when an additional colour imitates a fifth colour, e.g. white. In this case please place all elements containing an additional colour on a separate layer.

Please do not exceed the maximum percentage of colours in one point, which is 280%. This means for instance that the magnitude of a colour C100% M100% Y70% K10% is still acceptable.

ENRICHMENTS

All elements designed for selective enrichment (gold-plating, silver-plating, varnishing, etc.) are to be placed on a separate layer and have their colour changed to K=100.

FONTS

Embed or outline all the fonts. Black text should only have one element K=100. The smallest acceptable text size is 5 points for K=100 and 7 points for colourful text.

OTHERS

For correct printing please flatten the contents of the file, except for the elements which are to be edited/deleted (e.g. cut lines, variables such as batch numbers, etc.)

Bitmaps (e.g. photos) in the project should be set and have a resolution of 300ppi (colour profile CMYK).

Barcodes should be prepared according to the guidelines "GS1 Poland" (the main guidelines are: graphics italicised, K=100, white background). Preparing the barcode correctly lies in the interest of the ordering side, we only check whether it works.

Save the file as a PDF (the newest version you have). The name of the file should correlate with the name of the order.




PREPARING FILE FOR 5th COLOR PRINT

- 1. Elements which are to be printed in e.g. a white toner should have spotted/additional colour in the CMYK system called "white" (they can be in any colour, eg. M=100%).
- 2. Please place all "white" elements on top on a separate layer.
- 3. While deciding the "filling printing" and "outline printing" please remember that the colour white is always printed first.
- 4. To prevent the white "spilling" from under the printed elements please make the white colour slightly smaller using the tool "offset patch".
